The formation of RAVEN has been one of my greatest accomplishment and for which I am most well know around the United States. Established in 1978, RAVEN, as an all volunteer men's center in St. Louis, Missouri organized to motivate nonviolence in men through counseling and education. In 1986, 216 men entered RAVEN's program bringing the total registration at that time to 1129 men. Beginning in the fall of 1978, I continually led weekly

counseling groups for men who batter and conducted program entry interviews. As of August 1985, I had planned and participated in 11 RAVEN volunteer staff trainings ranging in length from 18 to 36 hours, spoke on 179 occasions to the public and facilitated 18 professional trainings of 1/2, 1 and 2 day lengths. I had appeared on 22 TV shows and 22 Radio shows and presented workshops or talks at 13 national conferences. As part of this project I created the Ending Men's Violence National Referral Directory
